

Family Questions for Rosh Hashanna Musaf

- The first section of the Musaf talks about G-d as being our king. In our interactions, whether in shul or in person, do we feel that we are subjects to G-d's kingship. What can we do to make the world and our spirituality a better place to feel that hierarchical connection: (think about the world around us; think about our family structures; think about our connections to our global community).
- The second section of the Musaf talks about G-d as remembering us. Talk to your family and your friends as to how you want to be remembered and what will be your legacy? Do you think that our forefathers thought about their legacy and is it possible to create that legacy in the new world in flux.
- The third section of Musaf speaks of G-d through the sound of the Shofar as a call to action. What is our greatest calling today as responsible Jews and citizens? What are our responsibilities? How do we make our voices heard as the Shofar is heard? How is our responsibility different than that of the new, younger generation? Can we engage in a productive conversation with the younger generation? Can we still be leaders?
